CALL OF SAMUEL:

Call stories not only explain how a person came to have a certain job – in this case, why Samuel is a prophet – but also (and more importantly) they act as a kind of validation for a claim to authority. Abraham is a patriarch because he followed the instructions of a voice in the desert. Samuel is a prophet on account of his fidelity to a call that he could not understand at first, but one to which he remained faithful nonetheless. Later on the writers of the New Testament will use these same kinds of patterns to describe the call of the disciples, of Paul, and of the whole community.

This particular story of the call of Samuel is all the more poignant because of the ironic assistance of Eli, who is a priest and judge at the shrine at Shiloh. Eli has two ne'er-do-well sons who would ordinarily be expected to inherit his office. They embezzled goods at the tabernacle and harassed women who came there for prayer and offerings. Samuel, on the other hand, is not Eli's natural son, but he acts as a good son should. He rises in the night when he hears the call, and listens to Eli's counsel.
